

Who We Are





Wildacres is a conference center offering its facilities to nonprofit groups that conduct educational or cultural programs and seminars.

Situated on 1,600 acres at an elevation of 3,300 feet atop a mountain called Pompey's Knob. Wildacres is located halfway between Asheville and Blowing Rock in North Carolina's Blue Ridge Mountains. It is a true retreat, undisturbed by through-traffic or noises of the city.


There are 2 lodges, a dining hall, a library and auditorium, a pottery studio, printmaking studio, jewelry studio and lapidary, as well as multiple classroom spaces.

All sleeping rooms have private baths and either two twin beds, or one double and one twin bed. Accessible rooms are available upon request at registration.

Meals are served in the Dining Hall, buffet style or family style.

Due to health regulations, no pets are allowed – service animals are allowed only with prior notice and documentation.



Teaching artists will be available as needed throughout the day.

Tuition includes your chosen class along with room and dining. (six nights and 17 meals), based on a shared *double-occupancy room.

Please keep in mind that we do encourage roommates whenever possible as this will allow for greater enrollment in classes and at the Retreat overall! So encourage friends or family to attend and room with you – the more the merrier!

Single-occupancy rooms are available upon request, for an additional \$155 fee.

Travel companions sharing a room but not taking a class can be added at registration for \$400 to cover their six-night stay and meal service.

Students are responsible for bringing their own materials (materials lists will be provided for each class approximately 4-6 weeks before sessions begin).

Please note that some classes also require an additional supply fee (payable directly to instructors) to cover supplies provided by the teaching artist.

* If you do not know anyone else attending but wish to share a room, you will be provided with a questionnaire to help us place you with a roommate match.

"All classes have limited spots available as class sizes are limited and available on a first-come basis. After you fill out the registration form, you will receive an individual email from Redux confirming your registration. Registration is **NOW OPEN**. Registration closes **June 15th** for Summer Sessions and **September 22nd** for Fall Sessions. If a class is full when you register, you will be notified by email that your name has been added to the Waitlist should a spot become available.

PAYMENT:

A 50% deposit will be due upon confirmation of registration. \$250 of that deposit is nonrefundable.

Remaining balances must be paid in full by July 1st for Summer Sessions, and October 1st for Fall Session to secure your space in the workshop.

Registrations made after these deadlines will require a full payment immediately upon registration confirmation.

Payments can be made online with a credit/debit card by following the PayPal link provided to you via email (following registration). If you prefer to pay via check or by card over the phone, this can be arranged – all tuition payments will be made to Redux Contemporary Art Center.

Failure to place a deposit or pay in full by allotted dates will result in a canceled registration and removal from the class, you prefer to pay via check or by card over the phone, this can be arranged – all tuition payments will be made to Redux Contemporary Art Center. Failure to place a deposit or pay in full by allotted dates will result in a canceled registration and removal from the class.

CANCELLATIONS:

Payments and deposits for canceled registrations are partially refundable until July 1st for Summer Sessions, or October 1st for Fall Session. After these dates, only emergency situations will be eligible for a refund. Cancellation of any registration by a registrant must be made by notifying Redux Contemporary Art Center via email and must be confirmed by Redux to be effective. Cancellation made on behalf of Redux or Wildacres will of course result in a full-refund to all affected registrants.

Come and learn or advance your skills in hand building, wheel throwing, glazing and firing with us, atop a beautiful mountain this summer and fall in North Carolina. Your team instructors, Annette and Seth, will inspire students to push their creative ideas and advance their skills in clay. In this fast paced and energetic workshop, students will create three to five pieces from start to finish. Students will experience Raku firing, sawdust firing and low fire glaze.

All skill levels are welcome in this intensive and comprehensive class. We'll work hard, create art and have a great time! ***This workshop is a lot of fun, but can be more time intensive than other workshops. You should expect to spend more time in the studio than the allotted time on the schedule.


Annette Sidner holds an MFA from the University of South Florida. She has been a faculty member at the State College of Florida for the past 18 years and retired from teaching there in May 2018. Annette taught a variety of courses; Ceramics 1&2, Wheel Throwing 1&2, Three Dimensional Design and Sculpture 1&2. She taught 10 years with Seth Barendse at WildAcres Retreat for Ringling College of Art + Design. They continue to teach the Clay Studio at Wildacres. Her work has been shown in Sarasota and Bradenton College Faculty shows and local galleries in those cities. She recently attended a residency at Watershed Center for the Arts. Annette is published in Lark Books 500 Figures In Clay Vol.II.

Seth Barendse has been working with clay for over 20 years. He received his BFA from Oregon College of Art and Craft in 2011. During the past 20 years he has taught ceramics at Booker High Schools Visual Performing Arts Program, Workshops at WildAcres and on campus for Ringling College of Art and Design, and was the studio manager at the State College of Florida. Barendse also assisted Cynthia Bringles workshop at Penland School of Craft in 2015. He is currently teaching at the Art Center of Manatee, Carla's Clay, and Ringling College of Art and Design in Sarasota FL. He has been the consultant for the build-out of Ringling Colleges new ceramic studio at their new Sarasota Museum Campus and is now the Studio Technician. His work has been exhibited in Florida, North Carolina, Colorado, Tennessee, New York, Oregon, and California



Get ready to dive in head-first in this exciting five day immersion of landscape painting techniques, demonstrations, and artistic camaraderie alongside award-winning artist Greg Barnes as your personal guide. Focusing on different aspects of producing a captivating landscape painting, both indoors and out, explore in either pastel or oil as Greg tailors his instruction to reach all levels from beginning pointers to advanced techniques. Working from a combination of creating in-studio and plein air immersion and observation, and photo reference materials, the class will focus on capturing the essence of a scene through design, color harmonies, and intuitive interpretation. Throughout this week, days will consist of plein air demos mixed in with lectures and individual instruction and personal attention on location as well as in-studio. Whether your medium of choice is pastel or oil, it is Greg's goal that you will continue to learn from the experience long after the workshop has ended. The class will finish with a critique of each student's work.

Greg Barnes received a BFA from Wake Forest University in 1985. He began painting full time following the 911 incident of 2001, when he realized "life is short". He studied with Albert Handell and Scott Christensen early in his professional career. Currently he tours the country displaying his paintings in national art festivals, participating in plein air events, and teaching pastel and oil painting workshops. His work can also be found in Coconut Grove Gallery and Frame, Miami, FL, Karis Art Gallery, Hilton Head Island, SC, Oh Be Joyful Gallery, Crested Butte CO.

Connect to your creativity through playful exercises that encourage taking risks, following your instincts and celebrating spontaneity. Get lost in the process and find new parts of your artistic vocabulary along the way. Materials will include colored pencils, collage and acrylics on paper. With an emphasis on abstraction, we will utilize a wide range of inspiration including the Wildacres setting itself! This 2-D mixed media class will focus more on the process than the outcome and is not your typical demo style class. Come with an open mind and let your creativity lead the way!

Anne Abueva lives and work in Charleston, SC.

"My studio practice is the best tool I have for articulating, expressing and interpreting everyday moments and memories. A therapist once told me to "let it out on a cellular level" and that advice still guides me in the studio. I work, play, experiment and edit, letting intuition guide the way. My backgrounds in interior design and experience with intuitive artmaking are both central to my creative process."

Metalsmithing Fundamentals:

Jewelry Making 101

In this workshop we will dive into metalsmithing and jewelry making by learning the essential skills of the craft. This course will cover metal piercing, sawing, filing, soldering, polishing, and tab setting gemstones through project-based instruction. Each student will create a few wearable works including a set of stacking rings, a pair of earrings, and a piece of jewelry with a tab set gemstone. No previous experience is required and students will leave with a base knowledge of metalsmithing that they can continue to grow.

A materials list will be provided after registration. Additional materials may be provided by your teaching artist (at cost payable directly to your teaching artist) if/as needed. Students may also make use of local gem shops throughout the week!



Hand Papermaking For Personal Use:

A season of Plant Color

Books, printmaking and paper lovers alike, will enjoy this immersion of creative processes for creating your own handmade papers, prints from the press, bound and unbound books, stand alone prints and paper art.

Expect a hands-on sheet making journey with local plant fibers, mica and treasures from the trails. Learn how to identify and harvest plants for hand papermaking. Learn how to process, pulp, press, create sheets and dry textured papers, learn to create formation aids, the vocabulary – learn processes that can be recreated at home with simple equipment. Expect to learn about inclusions, overlays, natural dyes and have access to natural dye vats. Build a supply of paper for printing, drawing, writing and book arts or use during and after the week's experience at home. Leave this workshop with the knowledge to create paper at home, how to use a printing press and print at home without a press. Leave with a portfolio of different paper examples, and handmade books using different bookbinding techniques shared during the week.


Catherine Cross Tsintzos is an Interdisciplinary/Multidisciplinary Artist with a focus on environmental and social issues, traditional fine craft and sustainability. She has a clear purpose in building and crossing bridges among the arts with a deep focus and balance between artistic practice, teaching, activism and invitation for participation. Catherine has spent her life's work developing programs and teaching in the arts in the Southeast United States for all ages and abilities. She is a NC artist from Greensboro and spends most of her time in Florida where she has been actively involved with arts education at the Orlando Museum of Art for the past 15 years. Catherine works with arts organizations, museums and universities including Frederick Book Arts Center, MD, Rollins College/FL, Duke University Continuing Studies/NC, Louise Wells Cameron Art Museum/NC, Greenville Center for Creative Art/SC

and the Florence County Museum/SC currently. Her love for the element of surprise and process art have lead her to working with mediums that include clay, paper, printmaking, book and fiber arts, alternative photographic processes, natural plant dyes and earth pigments. Through her museum work she has had the privilege to work with many national and international artists and works of art that have continued to scaffold her interest in being a lifelong learner and to keep the creative process fresh and invigorated with her personal art making.

Luminous Watercolor

INSTRUCTOR: DWIGHT ROSE

Enjoy five days of experimentation and fun while learning the fundamentals of watercolor painting, with plenty of individual attention, critiques, corrective techniques, and demonstrations. You will learn the basic techniques, specific to this medium, and the properties of the colors, vital to creating more fluid, fresh and transparent paintings. This class will also help you achieve good color harmony in your paintings. The instructor will provide step-by-step approaches from beginning to completion of the entire painting process. The primary focus of the workshop will be how to paint accurate land-scape scenes, with techniques to render realistic light and shadow effects.

Becoming more fluid, fresh and transparent in your color mixes will be an emphasis in this course. Using your own or supplied reference, learn how to plan highlights, use multicolor washes for glazing and underpainting, capture alluring details, and create effective shadows. Dwight Rose will help you use a quick sketch technique to identify dominant shapes and block your composition. You will build up multiple layers of color washes and learn to keep your whites clean! He will also show how to add both realistic and natural elements in your work from dark shadows and foreboding skies to sprawling fields and lustrous foliage. Images will mainly be land-scapes, yet you may pursue your favorites.

Some prior experience in drawing and watercolor painting is help-ful but not required. Drawings, color mixing, using varied brush strokes, wet-on-wet and dry brush techniques, and creating visual texture will be introduced through step-by-step demonstrations. Benefit from Dwight's effective style of teaching through hand-outs, multiple demonstrations, individual attention, supportive critiques, and easy-to-understand explanations of technical information on watercolor materials, color theory and composition.


Dwight Rose is a professional fine artist and art educator. Earning his BFA at the Ringling College of Art and Design, he started his 30-year teaching career with the College. Rose continued teaching university level studio courses and a variety of watercolor classes and workshops for diverse audiences in the USA and abroad. His teaching is recognized as a supportive and inspired, and his success is demonstrated by his dedicated students. Over his decades of painting, Rose's work has been featured in solo and group exhibitions, and won awards in states from Florida to Massachusetts, in Istanbul and Doha, Qatar. Memberships in national and state watercolor societies indicate his professional standing and peer recognition. Recent solo exhibitions were featured at the Milliken Gallery at Converse College, Blowing Rock History and Art Museum, the Peacock Gallery at Middle Georgia State University, and the Etherredge Center Gallery at the University of SouthCarolina at Aiken. His work is collected by the City of Greer, Spartanburg County Public Library, the Hobcaw Barony, and many private collectors. Dwight is currently a member of the National Watercolor Society, Florida Watercolor Society and the Manatee Art Center in Bradenton Florida.



Finding & Painting:

The Essence of Landscape, A Plein Air Combination

INSTRUCTOR: JUDY MCSWEEN

Come join abstract painter Judy McSween as we focus on the light, lines, and colors that bring landscape to life. You'll use the elements and principles of art to discover the essence of a landscape that feels both personal and universal—finding a quiet private moment in nature that's recognizable by others. Combining the freshness of Plein air painting with the deliberation that studio painting affords, you'll work from observation, photos, and sketches. Days will be a combination of in-studio demos on composition and design mixed with Plein air demos on how to see and "read" color and space. Judy will share techniques, skills, and tips she uses in her painting practice that you can add to your own toolbox. You may even dip into a bit of abstraction if it calls you during the week!

Judy works from these tenets:

- Have a personal connection with the subject—know it and feel it
- Be curious about different ways to show and share that subject
- Sketch it. Sketch it many ways
- Be willing to walk away from it when it's not working
- Be willing to destroy it
- Work on multiples at the same time
- Learn to stop and let it go
- Believe there's always another one

Whether you're a beginning painter or an advanced one, Judy will provide personalized instruction to encourage you to stretch and grow as an artist. It's her goal that each student comes away validated, renewed, and ready to move forward in their personal practices using skills learned this week.

Judy McSween received a BFA/ Specialization in Painting from Bowling Green State University in 1983. She was a public school art teacher in Ohio and South Carolina for over twenty years, retiring in 2022. Having taught preschool children through high school


students, as well as adults at local art centers, she is an advocate for the power of art to heal, educate and empower. What A Relief: Linocut Printmaking

Learn the basics of relief printmaking - preparing a design, carving a block for printing, and pulling your prints. Using linoleum blocks, we will discuss the use of value and mark to create black and white imagery before looking at ways to create multi layer, multi color prints using registration strategies and transparent inks for multi-layer print approaches. Intended for beginners, advanced students are welcome to discuss more ambitious projects.

Adrian Rhodes received her BFA in 2005 and MFA in 2011, both from Winthrop University. She is the recipient of the South Carolina Arts Commission's 2020 Individual Artist's Fellowship and the Winner of the 2020 701 CCA Prize from the 701 Center for Contemporary Art in Columbia, SC. Nature Journaling

With Watercolor and Gouche

This class if for anyone who wants to learn lightweight and convenient ways to paint and create on the go, but also wants to improve their observation skills, sketching practice, improve understand of value, perspective, proportions, reinforces color theory, and reminds them to plan. All of these can help participants in their other art endeavors as well. Students will work in the size of journal of their choice, but this year, Kari will be working a bit larger 4.5 x 6 – 5.5 X 8 to allow for more options on the page. She will show you ways to strengthen your journal entries by using different diagram layouts.

Since journaling is often done while traveling, Kari likes to give the class the opportunity to take one or two optional field trips during the week depending on other events Redux plans during the day. Minimum walking is required. These will give the class practical experiences in painting on location and different plant life to observe.

It is recommended that you have some drawing and painting experience to make things easier for you but bring your cell phone and use drawing aps if needed. Even if you have never worked with watercolor or gouache before, you will still be able to create memories in your journals. This class is more about remembering experiences than it is about making masterpieces. You can make it as serious as you want to; journaling is personal.

If you are a teacher, there are many ways to take what we do during the week and share it with your students regardless of the subject you teach. Kari taught school for 30 years in the elementary and middle schools gifted and art programs in TX and GA and can give you a variety of ideas on implementation in the classroom.

Since most of Kari's journaling work is small, she uses technology for her daily demonstrations and the image is projected to the 42inch TV so students will be able to see. She will begin each morning with discussion/demonstrations and be available to students the rest of the afternoon for assistance and guidance. Depending on the heat, fieldtrips may be offered earlier in the day, but the class will return before lunch. Each day will allow time for you to practice the techniques and ask any questions.

Jewelry Making 102

In this course we will brush up on the essential skills of metalsmithing and grow your bench skills to the next level. Each student will leave the class with a pair of earrings or pendant, at least one handmade chain, and a piece of jewelry featuring a prong set stone. This course would be great for either a beginner or someone looking to grow their jewelry making skills. **Perfect option if you want to stay for both weeks of instruction or if you have previously taken Metalsmithing Fundamentals from me at Wildacres.



Fall provides a wealth of interesting plant changes and color to incorporate into art making. During the week students will learn about a variety of surface design techniques for paper and cloth to include direct printing with the printing press for planographic prints, gel plate printing, cyanotype, relief printing with hand carved stamps, printing directing directly from from nature and colorful paste papers. The goal will be to prepare papers and cloth for binding a minimum of two hard cover books with up to five soft cover books documenting a memory of fall at Wildacres.

Students will learn painterly techniques, three bookbinding techniques, how to use the press and how to print at home. The process of creating prints from plant material with eco printing will be taught and how to capture images on paper and cloth with the suns UV rays for the alternative photographic process called cyanotype. Students will learn how to create organic paints and printing ink from plant dyes and collected soil samples from the campus at Wildacres as well as handmade paint brushes and mark making tools for creative warm exercises.


A series of bookmaking demonstrations will allow students to learn both traditional binding methods and more contemporary techniques. How to make page window, add in folded paper pop-ups, signatures, and three-dimensional covers using plaster. Students can expect to have books for personal use or gifts for giving.

<u>Catherine Cross Tsintzos</u> is an Interdisciplinary/Multidisciplinary Artist with a focus on environmental and social issues, traditional fine craft and sustainability. She has a clear purpose in building and crossing bridges among the arts with a deep focus and balance between artistic practice, teaching, activism and invitation for participation.Catherine has spent her life's work developing programs and teaching in the arts in the Southeast United States for all ages and abilities. She is a NC artist from Greensboro and spends most of her time in Florida where she has been actively involved with arts education at the Orlando Museum of Art for the past 15 years. Catherine works with arts organizations, museums and universities including Frederick Book Arts Center, MD, Rollins College/FL, Duke University Continuing Studies/NC, Louise Wells Cameron Art Museum/NC, Greenville Center for Creative Art/SC and the Florence County Museum/SC currently. Her love for the element of surprise and process art have lead her to working with mediums that include clay, paper, printmaking, book and fiber arts, alternative photographic processes, natural plant dyes and earth pigments. Through her museum work she has had the privilege to work with many national and international artists and works of art that have continued to scaffold her interest in being a lifelong learner and to keep the creative process fresh and invigorated with her personal art making and interpreting everyday moments and memories. A therapist once told me to "let it out on a cellular level" and that advice still guides me in the studio. I work, play, experiment and edit, letting intuition guide the way. My backgrounds in interior design and experience with intuitive artmaking are both central to my creative process."
